Official Start Time

The official event start time is 2pm Friday 21st October 2022 to allow for arena familiarisation. This is the start time for the period of jurisdiction for all Equestrian Sport New Zealand (ESNZ) General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations and ESNZ Dressage/Para Equestrian rules. Please note Dressage NZ/Para equestrian rules do not allow the use of prohibited gear <u>from time of arrival at the event</u>.

Official Finish Time

The official finish time will be sixty minutes after the completion of the last class or 60 minutes after the completion of all presentations for the event whichever is the latter.

Health & Safety Information

Dressage NZ and Dressage Bay of Plenty are committed to providing and maintaining a safe and healthy event for all participants, and to providing the information, training and supervision needed to achieve this.

- 1. All competitors and associated volunteers/staff/visitors to the venue must abide by the ESNZ/Dressage NZ/Para NZ, NZ GR Rules, Bay of Plenty Dressage and NEC Health and Safety Policy.
- 2. Dressage Bay of Plenty and The National Equestrian Center Health & Safety Policy's operate robustly under the Health & Safety at Work Act 2015.
- 3. Dressage Bay of Plenty Health and Safety coordinator is Kate Honour 027 275 3627
- 4. Copies of the event Health & Safety policy can be found at the Event Office.
- 5. Any incident or near miss must be reported to the Event Office and an incident form completed.
- 6. Any hazards identified must be reported to the Event Office.
- 7. Competitors will be responsible for their safety at all times and must observe safe practices and follow event rules and officials' instructions at all times, ensuring that others are not put a risk by their actions.
- 8. Each Competitor and/or exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created, accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves at the venue of the Event
- 9. Dressage Bay of Plenty operates under a ZERO TOLERANCE to bullying policy.
- 10. Ticking the H&S Box on Evo Events as you enter is confirmation that you have read and will abide by these requirements.

Liability

- 1. Competitors and spectators attending this event do so at their own risk.
- 2. The National Equestrian Centre, ESNZ, DNZ or Dressage BOP nor any representative of these bodies, accepts any liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to horse/pony/rider, spectators, land, vehicles or any personal property whether caused by their negligence or breach of contract in any way whatsoever.
- 3. The National Equestrian Centre, ESNZ, DNZ or Dressage BOP will not be liable for the security of goods/equipment or the loss of. Damage to such, stored at the venue, during the event.

ESNZ Concussion Policy

- 1. This event will be run under the ESNZ Concussion Policy Guidelines.
- 2. Dressage NZ policy requires all riders to report to Medical Officer or Steward following a fall.
- 3. Medical clearance must be obtained before remounting or competing.

Event Conditions

- 1. This event is run under ESNZ General Rules, Vet Rules & ESNZ Rules for Dressage/Para Equestrian. The FEI Code of Conduct applies.
- 2. Approved Dressage NZ horse identification numbers must be worn at all times, including warm-up.
- 3. All horses/ponies staying on grounds must have an ID tag at all times with rider details and contact number. See "Horse Yards & Accommodation" conditions below. Failure to comply with this will result in a \$50 fine per horse per incidence.
- 4. Stallions must comply with ESNZ Article 147 and must be housed in a stable at all times.

Competition Arena Use & Familiarisation

- 1. All competition arenas are closed at all times except as follows: 2pm 5pm, Friday 21st October 2022.
- 2. Not ALL arenas may be available at these times please check with the Steward to clarify.
- 3. Horses may be ridden on the <u>sand arenas only</u> at these times. Riders are expected to show courtesy and consideration to others wishing to ride at these times. This is to allow for arena familiarization ONLY and is not intended for general schooling.
- 4. Finish times will be strictly enforced to allow arena grooming. Horses may be walked around the outside only of any grass arenas used.
- 5. Designated warm up area is open during hours of daylight and is ONLY for the use of horses/ponies entered in this competition.
- 6. The Martin Collins Arena (fibre outdoor warm up arena) is only for use by those combinations entered in the classes in Arena 1, the Oro Equestrian Premier Arena.

Venue Rules

- 1. **<u>No smoking</u>** in any buildings or in yard/stable areas. Fines and/or elimination may result.
- 2. Any damage to the National Equestrian Centre facilities to be reported immediately to the Event Office.
- 3. Riding Helmets must comply with ESNZ General Regulations Article 151, specifically "While riding at any showgrounds/competition venue, or ESNZ venue when training, the use of properly fastened approved, tagged protective headgear will be mandatory".
- 4. All horses and ponies on the grounds must be entered at the event.

Dogs

- 1. Dogs must be kept in the truck park and be on a lead at all times.
- 2. No dogs are allowed in any stable or yarding areas, warm up, competition areas or buildings.
- 3. Dogs may be exercised on the cross-country course only.
- 4. Failure to comply will result in an instant \$50 fine and the dog owner's elimination from the competition.

Vehicles & Motorbikes

- 1. Speed limit for all vehicles 10kph.
- 2. Motorbikes may not be used after 8.30 pm and must be used in accordance with normal road rules. Any competitor contravening these rules will be fined and immediately eliminated from any further participation in the show. Fastened helmets must be worn.
- 3. The appropriate licenses must be held by anyone operating any vehicle or motorbike (i.e., no one under 16).
- 4. Approved safety helmets must be worn when riding motorbikes at all times.

Professional Services

- 1. Equine Therapists and Treatment:
 - a. Any equine therapists or practitioners who are not veterinarian and intend to provide therapeutic treatment to equines in any capacity at this event in a private or commercial basis must notify the Organising Committee of any treatment prior to the event.
 - b. All practitioners must also comply with the Conditions applicable to this event set out in the Schedule of classes.
 - c. Riders who own their equipment (eg Equissage, Cyclossage or similar) are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems at the event.
 - d. Any practitioner receiving financial or other gain from providing therapies at the event will be required to pay a trade exhibitor fee at the discretion of the Organising Committee.
- 2. Other Professionals:

Any other professional intending on providing services at this event must obtain prior agreement from the Organising Committee – this excludes professional Dressage Coaches assisting in the warmup of competitors.

Horse Identification, Horse Yards, Venue & Accommodation

- 1. Approved Horse/pony official identification numbers must be worn on both sides of the horse/pony at all times during warm up and competition, and when being ridden or led in arena familiarization. ID Tag with Horse Name, Rider phone contact <u>must be worn</u> in or out of the stable/yard at all other times.
- 2. If the owner/rider leaves the venue, a person responsible for the horse must be nominated and the appropriate form (available at the event office) <u>MUST</u> be filled in and signed by both the owner/rider and the nominated person. The nominated person's contact details must then be attached to the horse's halter or cover. This is an NEC Health & Safety requirement and will be strictly enforced. Failure to comply will result in a \$50 fine per horse per incidence.
- 3. Moving horses to unallocated yards/paddocks is <u>STRICTLY prohibited</u>. PLEASE remember it is very inconvenient for those arriving later than you to find a horse in their allocated yard. Failure to comply will result in an instant \$50 fine.
- 4. Please use the skips provided for horse waste, not rubbish bins are provided for rubbish.
- 5. Please keep wash down bays clean at all times.

- 6. All yards/stables are to be left properly mucked out. Muck skips will be located near the yards. Noncompliance will result in a fee of \$100 being charged. Take a photo of your cleaned out yard (ensuring yard number is in the photo) prior to leaving the show ground.
- 7. Where yarding requests cannot be met, refunds will be paid after the show.
- 8. Yards will not be allocated until full payment of entries etc is received. Yards are allocated in order of full receipt of entries (including payment).
- 9. When not competing, it is compulsory that horses/ponies are identified with ID tags that include the name of the person responsible and their mobile number. Failure to comply will result in a \$50 fine per horse per incidence.
- 10. All vehicles/caravans connected to power must have a up to date electrical certificate of fitness.

Entries, Entry Fees & Prize Money

- 1. Entries will close on 28th September 2022 <u>www.evoevents.co.nz.</u>
- 2. Draw and Yarding allocations will be available at <u>www.evoevents.co.nz</u>. If required, a revised draw and/or start times for the following day's competition will be available 6.30pm each evening on the results board in the office. It is the rider's responsibility to check for new times.
- 3. Any outstanding amounts owing from any previous Dressage Bay of Plenty Event must be paid before entries will be confirmed.
- 4. The OC reserves the right to alter the program to ensure the smooth running of the event.
- 5. The OC reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 6. Payment must be made with entries or entry is not accepted.
- 7. Entries will not be accepted without ESNZ rider & horse registrations current to 25th October 2022.
- 8. Annual Dressage Start is required to gain points in any Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyle Series, Prestige Futures Prize, Pony and Young Rider Performance Leagues, or Top 10 League.
- 9. No phone/email entries will be accepted.
- 10. Maximum of two starts per day per horse/pony. Maximum of 6 tests per day per rider.
- 11. Horses may only be entered for one Level of Championship.
- 12. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Event Secretary but will incur a \$40 per horse fee which will not be eligible for a refund.
- 13. Class numbers will be limited to 40, and entries will be accepted in order of receipt of payment of entry fees. Where classes are oversubscribed, preference will be given to riders entering the tests required to contest a level championship, with others being waitlisted. Riders will be advised if they are waitlisted.
- 14. Classes may be cancelled/combined if there are insufficient entries.
- 15. Change of Class Fee is \$20 and is non-refundable, unless due to a change in horses' grade or rider category. Class changes are not permitted after close of entries.
- 16. Preliminary to Advanced Medium will be run as one class, however points will be awarded for Bronze, Silver and Gold categories towards the overall individual category championship.
- 17. Bronze, Silver and Gold classification Combinations are eligible for one level only. Category level as at the evening prior to the start of the event.

- 18. Para classes are open to classified Grade I V riders. Riders must ride in their grade. Orange para disks must be worn on each side of the saddle cloth.
- 19. Payment by via Polipay (preferred), or Internet Banking to 06 0413 0428945 00 with riders and horse name (one horse name only if entering more than one) and a telephone number as a reference.
- 20. Scratchings before close of entry are entitled to a full refund (minus Evoevents fees & Admin fees).
- 21. After close of entry date an 80% refund may be paid, and after 21st October a 50% refund may be paid subject to condition 22.
- 22. Scratchings after close of entry date must be accompanied with a vet or doctor's certificate to qualify for a refund. All refunds are at the discretion of the OC.
- 23. Scratchings must be made via email (<u>dressagebayofplenty@gmail.com</u>) (NOT on social media), or via Evo Events if prior to the close of entries.
- 24. Prizemoney will be paid to 4th place with rosettes to 5th (except for Zilco MFS rosettes to 4th). Prizes may be substituted with sponsor products of the same or greater value.
- 25. All refunds and prize money will be issued after the show and paid by direct credit. Please ensure your bank details are up to date in Evo Events.
- 26. Prizegiving for overall Championships and Super 5 Classes will be on Monday 25th October– times and details will be advised but will be as soon after Championship points are calculated as possible (i.e., staggered prizegivings). Riders are required to attend or arrange a stand-in, or awards will be forfeited.
- 27. Unmounted prizegiving for classes will be held at the end of each day. Details to be advised.
- 28. Protests & Complaints: Protests and complaints may be considered by the Ground Jury at the event in accordance with Art 137 of the ESNZ General Regulations. As a guideline only, protests must be lodged within 60 minutes of the completion of the competition to which the protest relates, and a complaint within 60 minutes of the completion of the event. The Ground Jury is the sole judge of time in both cases. For complete rules and official documentation required, please refer to https://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/esnz/rules-regulations/
- 29. **Equal Placings:** In the case of equality in any qualifying class, the higher collective marks will determine the higher placing. If the competitors are still equal, then the higher co-efficient marks will determine the placings. If there is still an equality of points, the competitors are given the same placing.
- 30. **Music:** Riders can email their music to Steph at <u>dressagemusicals@gmail.com</u> for it to be loaded and checked on her computer **before the show**. Please provide Steph with your **name**, **horse name**, **class and level**. If you decide not to do this, please ensure your music (MP3 or WAV format on USB stick) is dropped off to the office at least four hours prior to the start of your class.

Special Awards

McDreamy Trophy: Best Performed BOP Combination – Donated by Kellie Hamlett. Riders competing in Prelim – GP are eligible and must be a current financial member of one of the 4 BOP dressage groups.

Best Performed Young Rider* – on a horse or pony, rider must be over 16 and up to 21 years of age as of 1st August 2022.

Best Performed Junior Rider* – on a horse or pony, rider may be up to and including 16 years as of 1st August 2022.

Note - For the FEI Young Rider Championship classes: Young Riders include riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn twelve years (12) until they turn twenty-one (21) years of age. If a rider turns twenty-one (21) on or after 1 August they may continue to compete in Young Rider competitions until 31 July in the following calendar year, (ESNZ dressage rules - Article 462.3.4 <u>https://www.nzequestrian.org.nz/esnz/rules-regulations/esnz-rules/</u>).

Best Performed Masters Rider* – on a horse or pony, rider must be 50 years or over as of 1st August 2022

*All levels are eligible for these awards. Please indicate your eligibility on your entry.

Points will be allocated as per the table below. In the event of a tie, the horse contesting the highest level will be the winner.

Hanoverian Society Sashes: Awarded according to Hanoverian Society criteria.

Levels 1-9 and Para Equestrian Champion and Reserve Champion Awards: Points will be allocated across the classes indicated in each level in order to calculate the Champion & Reserve place getters for Bronze, Silver and Gold Championships. In the event of a tie the combination with the highest placing in the Super 5 test will be the winner or for Para, the highest score in the Individual Championship Test will be the winner. In the event of a further tie, the highest average percentage for the three championship tests will be the winner.

The OC reserves the right to merge championships within a level where insufficient entries are received.

Points are awarded as follows: 1st place = 20 points to 20th place = 1 point

DNZ Qualifiers: Premier League Shows are qualifiers for the 2023 Bates National Dressage Championships, Webb Equestrian Para Equestrian Championships, and Land Rover Horse of the Year.

Dressage NZ Leagues/Series: Horses/Ponies must have an annual start for Dressage to gain points in any Super 5 League, Zilco Musical Freestyle Series, Prestige Futures Prize, AMS Saddlery Pony and Young Rider Performance Leagues, or Top 10 League. Riders must register online at Evo Events prior to 1st November 2022 for inclusion in any Top 10 League, Prestige Dressage Futures Prize, AMS Saddlery Pony and Young Rider Performance Leagues.

Land Rover Dressage Team Leagues: For Dressage & Para Equestrian Athletes. Fun but Serious! A competition where riders have the chance to get their own teams together. Team Competitions in each island plus a grand national final.

Dunstan Accumulator Series Show – for financial members of BOP Clubs (as per the series rules) who have entered this series by 11th August 2022.
